SYNOPSIS

Shaw Templeton (Nolan Lyons) is already experiencing life's harsh realities well beyond his early teen years when his mother, whom he is solely caring for at home, dies following a protracted bout with cancer. Getting to school on time, keeping up with homework and friends immediately become luxuries he can't afford when Shaw finds himself the responsibility of his estranged father William (James Le Gros), an alcoholic, emotionally fragile veteran eking out a bare bones existence in the woods of their economically depressed rural Pennsylvania town.

While his father spends his days hunting deer with his buddy John (Kevin J. O'Connor), as both beloved pastime and a means to put food on the table, Shaw races around on his bike, gathering his cherished belongings from the only home he has ever known, in an attempt to scrape together any semblance of the once comparatively stable life slipping away before his eyes. As he makes the effort to coexist with someone he doesn't know, much less know if he can trust, Shaw sees occasional glimmers of the responsible parent his father seems to want to be.

But William may ultimately be too damaged, rendering him incapable of being what his son needs most as Shaw indefatigably pursues a dignified burial for his mother. And in the process, perhaps without even realizing it, a path to a better life for himself despite having no one to show him the way.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

BUCK RUN is an excavation of my heart. Though Shaw's a fifteen-year-old kid, and I was a thirty-year-old man when the film began, I still harbored upset toward my father, grief over my mother's death, and bittersweet memories of my rural Pennsylvania home. The film was incredibly cathartic - I was Shaw, through and through.

I wanted to put both Shaw and the world around him on the screen in a way that was fair to both father and son. During my prep, I came up against the cynicism I held since I was a boy - I had come to know where I grew up through this lens, rarely opening myself to the beauty and pain in the people around me. Location scouts for BUCK RUN quickly turned into conversations with people I'd never imagined I would meet and become close with, and reunification with childhood memories and friends. Working on the script became a means of understanding my father, and seeing myself in him, him in me. The visual language of the film turned into a subjective look at Shaw, still a boy with time, and a locked-off, unforgiving look at William, a man with little.

BUCK RUN is a coming-of-age story with the hope that emerges from acceptance and the forever bond of family. I hope it inspires empathy and forgiveness for our flawed parents.

CINEMATOGRAPHER ANNA FRANQUESA SOLANO



Born in Barcelona, Anna is a New York based cinematographer who has worked extensively in film and documentary, Anna has benefited from her background in Art History and Theory.

Her most recent work with Lulu Wang's **THE FAREWELL** (*Best Actress Golden Globe Winner 2020*) was in the Official Competition at Sundance 2019 and now being distributed by A24.

His last film as director was the 2009 thriller DAYLIGHT, which was the 'Critic's Pick' in both The New York Times and The New York Post on its release.

LEANDROS NTOUNIS (Sound Designer) has been working as a sound designer and production sound mixer for feature films, documentaries and TV commercials since 2000. His main artistic interest lies within art-house films with strong authoritarian vision, accommodating the creative needs of each individual project.

His most acclaimed works as a Sound Designer include **DOGTOOTH**, which premiered at the 2009 *Cannes Film Festival*, and his following film ALPS, which premiered at the 68th *Venice Film Festival*; ATTENBURG, which won the Official Competition at the 67th *Venice Film Festival*, and Independent Spirit Award-nominated CHEVALIER.

MATT JOHNSON (Colorist) studied under Director Athina Rachel Tsangari at the University of Texas and eventually went on to form Haos Film with Tsangari.

He is an Editor and Animator, in addition to his work as a Colorist. His past works include THE SLOW BUSINESS OF GOING, which won the "Best Film Award" at *New York Underground Film Festival*, "Best of the Fest" at *Edinburgh International Film Festival*, and many more awards; **ATTENBURG**, which **won the Official Competition at the 67**th *Venice Film Festival*; and CHEVALIER, which screened in "Contemporary World Cinema" at the 2015 *Toronto International Film Festival*.

HARLEY KAPLAN (Gasting Director) is a co-founder and casting director with Powers/Kaplan Casting, a bi-coastal casting office that specializes in independent film. Since forming Powers/Kaplan in 2010, Harley has cast the *Cannes Director's Fortnight* award-winning BLUE RUIN and *Sundance* film THE COMEDY, as well as THE SECTOR, THE TELL-TALE HEART, and promotional campaigns for SONY, RANDOM HOUSE, CAROLINA HERRERA, and PURISTICS.

Harley began his career as a production trainee at *Fox Television* before moving on to various positions at *New Line Cinema*. He started out in casting with the legendary office of Hopkins/Smith/Barden, where he worked as a casting assistant on movies such as BOYS DON'T CRY, THE CIDER HOUSE RULES, and SIMPLY IRRESISTIBLE, as well as HBO's television series SEX AND THE CITY.

PRODUCER NANCY DEGNAN

Nancy Degnan is a Los Angeles based producer. Her debut feature film was BUCK RUN and she produced her second in 2019 - SILENT NOTES.

She participated in the 2020 Women In Film + Sundance Institute Finance Lab with her next project, FERAL, and is part of the 2019/20 Women In Film mentoring program.

As an Associate Producer, Degnan joined with Director, Jennifer Pepperman for the production of web-series AFTER FOREVER starring Kevin Spirtas (DAYS OF OUR LIVES) and Mitchell Anderson (DOOGIE HOWSER, M.D.), which won five Daytime Emmys, setting a record for the most Emmys won by an LGTBQ series in one year.

PRODUCER/EP JULIO LOPEZ VELASQUEZ

Producer Julio Lopez Velasquez is a filmmaker based out of Beverly Hills and Silicon Valley. He's the founder and CEO of Tomorrowland Production Company, which is dedicated to telling gripping, emotional stories that appeal to diverse audiences and artists alike.

Lopez Velasquez is a co-founder of Intuition Film Productions together with Producer Nancy Degnan and Director/Producer Nick Frangione to generate compelling, story-driven material that will appeal to multi-cultural audiences. BUCK RUN is the debut project for Intuition Film Productions.

In 2019, he produced the play "DOPE QUEENS" in Los Angeles, which got rave reviews, and has several projects in the works.
